Flowers, Herbs, and Vegetables: Growing a Backyard Garden into a Small-Scale Farm Business

You don't have to spend much time with Kristi Ruggles to realize her dedication to growing plants as ecologically and healthfully as possible; to being a lifelong learner; to being a steward of the soil and of the mountain traditions of her Appalachian home. Visiting her farm in Greenup County, it's easy to understand her love of the beautiful rolling hills and green valleys of her home - and to grasp the related difficulties of sourcing necessary tools, amendments and supplies; securing markets and building an agri-business in a rural locale. These topics arose again and again in Kristi's story of creating <u>Mountain GIrl Provision Company</u> to counter these challenges and increase success for her farm and regional, sustainable farms and gardens. The importance of collaboration and community with like-minded and peer growers is a strong theme and easy solution for Kristi's challenges. Her shift towards creating markets and growing her production business - which, for decades, was a hobby and backyard garden for her family - has involved connecting locally with Master Gardeners, farmers markets, local farm stores, and regionally/nationally with growers who offer resources, assistance and models of how to "market garden."

"It doesn't come easy for me; it's been hard to switch into production farming," Kristi explained. "I love the diversity of growing herbs, flowers and vegetables together. The Earthway seeder I've had for years is still in the box, because I don't naturally plant in rows!" Yet the shift for Kristi is evident on her farm: high tunnel, silage tarps, landscape fabric, broadfork, stirrup hoes, OMRI-listed amendments and organic seeds, intentional pollinator plantings and native plant plots and cover crops are integral to Kristi's production. Learning from years of farming conferences, specialized farming courses, books by farmer-authors and the old-fashioned art of paying close attention have allowed Kristi to mirror and mimic the market gardens she aspires to while maintaining the personal flavor of her own style and preferences.
